cause to hold that Tyler Renard has committed a minor violation of the Alabama Ethics Act, and further moved that this case be handled administratively and referred for review and appropriate legal action to the District Attorney of the appropriate Judicial Circuit. Mr. Dodd seconded the motion. Motion passed 3-0 with all those present voting.

## Charles Gordon, Coordinator II, Student Programs, Auburn University

Mr. Dodd moved that based on the evidence as presented to this Commission, there exists cause to hold that Charles Gordon has violated the Alabama Ethics Act, and further moved that this case be referred for review and appropriate legal action to the District Attorney of the appropriate Judicial Circuit. Mr. Pappas seconded the motion. Motion passed 3-0 with all those present voting.

# Laura McCoo-Feenstra, Personnel Assistant III, Alabama State Port Authority

Mr. Pappas moved that on October 2, 2024, the Alabama Ethics Commission unanimously found Laura McCoo-Feenstra, Personnel Assistant III, Alabama State Port Authority, had committed one (1) minor violation of the Alabama Ethics Act and approved an administrative resolution at the request of the Respondent. The Commission forwarded the case to the District Attorney of the 13th Judicial Circuit who approved the administrative resolution on May 20, 2025. Accordingly, I hereby move as follows: 1) An administrative penalty in the amount of \$500.00 be ordered by the Commission to be paid to the Ethics Commission by cashier's check, money order, or online payment on or before October 1, 2025; 2) Restitution in the amount of \$2,100.00 is ordered be paid to the Ethics Commission by cashier's check, money order, or online payment on or before October 1, 2025, and disbursed to Alabama State Port Authority thereafter. Mr. Dodd seconded the motion. Motion passed 3-0 with all those present voting.

# Case No. 2024-0307

Larry Holcomb, Mayor, City of Fultondale / Superintendent, Fultondale Gas Board Mr. Pappas moved that on <u>April 2, 2025</u>, the Alabama Ethics Commission unanimously found Larry Holcomb, Mayor, City of Fultondale / Superintendent, Fultondale Gas Board, had committed one (1) minor violation of the Alabama Ethics Act and approved an administrative resolution at the request of the Respondent. The Commission forwarded the case to the District Attorney of the 10<sup>th</sup> Judicial Circuit who approved the administrative resolution on April 15, 2025. Accordingly, I hereby move as follows: 1) An administrative penalty in the amount of \$100.00 be ordered by the Commission to be paid to the Ethics Commission by cashier's check, money order, or online payment on or before October 1, 2025; 2) Restitution in the amount of \$450.60 is ordered be paid to the Ethics Commission by cashier's check, money order, or online

payment on or before October 1, 2025, and disbursed to City of Fultondale thereafter. Mr. Dodd seconded the motion. Motion passed 3-0 with all those present voting.
